

# August 2016 - 1st Destination Survey Results

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#### **Overview**

The August 2016 survey begins the fifth year of using the 1st Destination Survey format. The August response rate is historically the lowest of the three graduations. The bachelor degree response rate is 15.4%, with a five-year range of 9.9% to 16.5%. The graduate degree response rate is 21.7%, the highest August response rate for the past five years. The five-year range is 14.5% to 21.7%. The following two charts show percentages of Plans in Place and Still Seeking for bachelor and graduate degrees for the past five years.

#### **Survey Administration**

Three email surveys are sent using Emma Email Marketing. The first survey goes to students who had applied for graduation with the Registrar's Office. The second and third surveys go to students on the Registrar's official list of graduates. Graduates' primary and secondary email addresses are used. The survey is open on the *1DS* website for three months.

Please note the following when using this data:

- Respondents to the first survey who did not graduate are not removed from the results.
- 2. Graduates self-report their major, which is often incorrect, so the results may not match Banner.
- In the case of multiple responses, only the most recent responses are counted using the last timestamped entry.
- Dual majors are counted twice, once for each major. Total responses reflect the number of majors, not graduates.

#### **Response Rate**


A total of 148 majors responded to the survey (baccalaureate and graduate). Eighty-nine (89) out of 578 bachelor degree majors responded and 59 of the 272 graduate degree majors responded. Combined, this represents a 17.4% response rate.


This chart represents the primary plans for the upcoming year for bachelor degree recipients.


At the conclusion of the survey period, 37.1% were still seeking employment. Another 3.4% had yet to decide on a plan; and 5.6% selected the Other category.


The remaining 53.9% of the graduating class had plans implemented.\*


The chart to the right illustrates how new bachelor positions were secured. The top 4 sources are Personal Networking, National Job Board, Previous Intern of Employer, and ther


The charts below show that 77.8% indicated their new position was related to their major and 66.7% of the positions were full-time.





A total of 59 graduate degree majors responded to the survey out of 272 majors for an overall response rate of 21.7%.




This chart represents the primary plans for the upcoming year for graduate degree recipients.


At the conclusion of the survey period, 11.9% were seeking employment, and 1.7% chose Other.


The remaining 86.4% of graduate degree recipients had plans implemented.\*






