



Prescribed Courses


Must take <u>first</u> semester. See handout for registration limitations. Courses will be listed on your plan & UD form

Must take UNIV 2020 <u>first</u> semester and meet GPA req.

Interested in the Honors Program?



Eligible for <u>Honors</u> if you're entering with...

- GPA of 3.5 or higher, and an ACT composite score of 25 or greater (incoming freshmen)
- 3.25 GPA or higher with 12+ hours (upperclassmen)

What is Teacher Candidacy?


Licensure

To become a Tennessee teacher, students must

- begin as a pre-candidate in a State Board of Education approved program
- 2. apply for Admission to Teacher Education (ATE)
- 3. complete both state licensure & MTSU degree requirements

In order to become a teacher candidate, students must be admitted to the Education Preparation Program (EPP)

If you fail to apply or qualify, you will not permitted to enroll in Upper Division courses and graduate






