ORCO 3250 students gain firsthand experience in the work and dedication that is required to build a nonprofit organization. Throughout the semester, students work in groups to choose a cause, create an event and budget, write press releases and grants, and present their work to a hypothetical grant panel. During these presentations, groups explain their project and ideas to the panelists so that their organization may be the chosen recipient for the fictitious grant.
