Student Health Services Examples of Fees

MTSU Student Health Services realizes the impact of the cost of medical care on students' budgets, and we work to provide comprehensive primary care, women's health, and healthy skin services at minimal cost to students. There is NO FEE for consultations with our staff for any illnesses. This is a covered service under student fees. Health Services charges nominal fees for labs, x-rays, and physicals priced significantly below private sector prices (i.e., strep test \$8, x-ray \$30, physical \$15) and offers reduced cost allergy desensitization, dietetic consults, and pharmacy services on site. We do not file insurance as Health Services is not contracted as an in-network provider with any domestic student insurance plan. We can provide a walk out statement if students wish to file the charges with their own insurance plan.

MTSU Campus Pharmacy: Our campus pharmacy fills prescriptions for on and off campus students, faculty, and staff. Students can transfer their current prescriptions to Campus Pharmacy. Our pharmacy does accept most prescription insurance plans. Campus Pharmacy also has a selection of generic medications offered at affordable cash prices for those students who are uninsured or do not wish to file their insurance.

Below are examples of typical visits to Health Services and Campus Pharmacy and the projected cost of each visit. Prescription prices are for the cash price of the medication. Out of pocket costs will vary if prescription insurance is used but should be the same as filling prescriptions off campus.

You have had a very sore throat and fever for three days and decided to come to the clinic for
evaluation. You are seen by a provider who examines you and recommends a test for strep throat.
Your nurse performs the test and enters the positive result in your electronic medical record. The
provider prescribes an appropriate antibiotic, and you fill the prescription at the MTSU pharmacy
for a generic copay.

With a splint you are able to walk well even without crutches. Your provider also gives you home exercises and asks you to follow-up in one week.

• You have a skin lesion on your arm. It has been there for a few years but has recently darkened in color and is easily irritated and even bleeds occasionally. You are concerned about it and decide that it's time to have it checked out. Your roommate mentions that Health Services has a Healthy Skin clinic that treats minor skin concerns and can even refer you to a local dermatologist if needed. You make an appointment and discuss your concerns with the provider. After inspecting the skin lesion and listening to your concerns about the recent changes, the provider recommends a biopsy to have the skin lesion tested for abnormalities. The provider explains the procedure and answers all your questions. The area is cleaned, numbed, and a small area is shaved off to send to the pathology lab for inspection. You are given aftercare instructions and schedule a follow-up appointment to check the biopsy site and discuss the pathology results.
