## Texas State University Masters Program

The Department of Philosophy at Texas State University is accepting applications for the Masters program in Applied Philosophy and Ethics

(MAAPE). First-year students are eligible to compete for Graduate Instructional Assistant (GIA) and Graduate Research Assistant (GRA) positions with a first-year salary of \$13k (9-months) and with the possibility of renewal for a second year. Travel support for professional conferences is available. Applicants who wish to be considered for a GIA/GRA position for Fall 2019 should complete the application for the MAAPE program by 1 March 2019 (https://www.gradcollege.txstate.edu/programs/maape.html).

The Department of Philosophy at Texas State University grants the BA in Philosophy, the MA in Applied Philosophy and Ethics, and offers undergraduate minors in Philosophy, Religious Studies (with a BA in Religious Studies to start in 2020), and Value Studies, as well as a graduate certificate in Professional Ethics.
