Two complainants phone numbers were changed at their request to prevent further harassment (the other complainants did not want their phone number changed).

** This number does not represent 1 alleged incident of sexual misconduct reported to the Office of Judicial Affairs and Mediation Services. In this instance, the complainant requested (in writing) that we not follow up on the situation and would not provide any information regarding who the suspect(s) was/were.
